

Station Approach Construction Update

Devonshire Road, Havelock Road, Cornwallis Terrace

Recent progress

Paving has been completed at the corner of Devonshire Road and Havelock Road and the footpath opened to the public. The work area has now moved to the opposite corner of Havelock Road at Cornwallis Terrace, where the next phase of excavation has started. This work included removing the existing kerb line, preparations for installing the new kerbs, and removing a lighting column.

What's happening next week

Excavation work will continue on the corner of Havelock Road and Cornwallis Terrace, with the new kerb line being installed as works progress. Once the kerbing is in place, the sub-base will be prepared ahead of the new paving and crossing point being installed.

Pedestrians should remain on the pavements and use the temporary crossings to follow the route around the site while works are underway.

Traffic management in place and coming up

Temporary traffic signals are in place 24-hours a day until 11 September. During this period, we will be carrying out the majority of the work, including, paving and resurfacing footways, installing new pedestrian refuge islands, drainage adjustments and associated activities such as kerbing and pedestrian guard rail adjustments.

From Monday 24 August overnight road closures will be in place between 8pm and 6am while we carry out carriageway reconstruction and resurfacing.

During these closures, traffic will be diverted via Cornwallis Terrace, Baybrook Road and South Terrace.

This diversion route is not suitable for HGVs or large vehicles. An alternative diversion will be in place via the A21 and A2101 St Helens Road.
